The best part was getting to meet most of the MRRC gang, many of whom I didn't know from before. You just can't know Mad River unless you come to the meetings and meet the people - check in to 3825 and share the triumphs and the setbacks of the members - join forces with them in Club Competitions. This comaraderie is the key that links us together across state and sectional boundries and makes us a real club - the Mad River Radio Club.

FROM THE BIG FISH by Bill Kelsey N8ET

First - I would like to thank all of you for your support in Dayton, although I have my doubts about any club that railroads in someone who has been away for five years, and at the time of the election is only semi-conscious on hay fever pills! In any event, it appears that the club has grown and become more organized while I was in England (G5CMX for those of you who are still not sure who you voted for). A lot of the organization depends on the editor of the flash, and we managed to keep a good one (he is already pestering me with deadlines). I hope we can continue to grow, or at least become a bit closer together as a club over the next year.

At Dayton, a few of you echoed concerns that I have had about MRRC, and I hope that in the next year we will be able to do something about them. Our club is spread out over a large geographical area, and some of us don't see any other members at any other time except at the two or three meetings we make each year. The club really doesn't have any activities other than the Sweepstakes effort and the four meetings. At least one of these meetings is the annual K8MR Christmas Party, and people dp get a chance to socialize a bit more there. I felt our Hospitality suite at Dayton this year was a good start in the right direction, being out of the mainstream such that you could actually talk to someone.

I have done a bit of thinking about how to pull MRRC a bit closer together, and would like to toss out a few ideas to consider. First - I marked up a map with the QTH of all the members. It appears that there are two main concentrations of members - Cleveland & Detroit, with minor concentrations around Findlay and Columbus. The balance of the membership is pretty much evenly spread throughout the club area. What I would like to propose are a few supplemental regional meetings. These would not be official meetings per se, but informal get-togethers at someone's QTH. I will have one the evening before Findlay - who would be willing to do the same in the Detroit and Columbus areas?

Second - I would like to see write ups from <u>everyone</u> describing their station, activities, plans, interests, etc. for publication in the 'Flash'. Along these lines, you will find elsewhere in this issue a questionare that I would like you to fill out & return. This will help me to find out who you all are, and also give you a chance to express what you would like to see us do as a club.

Third - I would like to investigate the possibility of a MRRC repeater. A well placed machine or two could at least link Detroit, Findlay and Findlay. Personally, I don't like to leave a rig on 3825 all the time, but an outof the way 2M repeater would not be so bad. I noticed there are a few of you in Wooster - perhaps a repeater there linked to one in Findlay - anyone volunteer tower space? I have plenty of 3/4" hardline to get RF to the antennas that I would be willing to donate to the cause. The Findlay Radio has offered to let us link into their repeater - let me know if any of you have access to other machines.

Fourth — the Monday Night Net is still going on 3825 kHz at 8:30 local time in case you have forgotten. There is a core group of 10 or 12 who are usually on. It would be good to hear from the rest of you from time to time also.

Those are my goals as Big Fish for 1984/85 - Bring the club closer together through informal regional get-togethers, descriptions of stations and operators in the 'Flash', investigate a repeater or linked repeaters to help keep everyone more in touch with the rest of the membership, and encouraging greater participation in the Monday Nite Net. The other long-standing goal of course is to win the Medium Club Category in SS.

Along those lines, I understand that the Northern California Contest Club is going after the Unlimited Club Category in SS this year, and they have sent out a open challenge to any club that might be entering that category. They are going to put up a case of California Champagne that they will win SS. They are hoping that other clubs will respond to the challenge and put up similar local food or beverege against the bet. Is there any interest in MRRC doing something similar in the medium club class? If so, let me know.

That is enough from me this time. I wish that I could have met more of you at Dayton. Hopefully, I will get to meet more of you at the NOARSFEST, Findlay and K8MR meetings. I intend to have a gathering at my QTH the evening before the Findlay hamfest — plan on coming. Also, I hope that many of you will respond by returning the questionare and commenting on my suggestions.

MRRC STATION UPDATES

The summer antenna season is upon us, and MRRC types are out in their yards repairing last year's damage and preparing next year's 'death ray'. To give you an idea of what your competition might be doing, here are a few hints of things to come....

W8UA - Mike has a very busy summer ahead of him. The 2L 40 0 115' is going to be replaced by a Telrex 3L on a 29' boom. The 204BA stack at 125'/60' will be refurbished with new baluns and stainless hardware. Fifteen will be the big change - going from 4L Skywalkers at $94^{\prime}/47^{\prime}$ to stacked 5L NBS yagis. The same tower will hold a new 160M quarter wave sloper. Finally, the 80M sloper system will be retired in favor of phased verticals.

KS8S - The Findlay gang have their summer's work cut out for them at Dean's antenna farm. The 180' tower will have two systems on it - 3L/3L on 40M at 180'/90' and 4L/4L on 20M at 120'/60'. Both of these stacks will have the top antenna rotatable and the bottom fixed on EU. The 100' Rohn 450G tower will have a 5L 20M and 5L 10M rotatable on top, and fixed 40M and 15M yagis side mounted to SA. The 100' self-supporting tower will have a 6L 15M yagi and a fixed 10M yagi to SA.

WD8LLD - Goose is in the process of buying a house in Wooster on 1.5 acres, and hopes to begin erecting towers soon. Plans are for two 140° towers and one 70° tall to support 6L/6L on 10M, 5L/5L on 15M and 4L/4L on 20M, with future plans for a 40M beam and a 2M DX info repeater. The big towers will be base insulated for use on 160° & 80° with lots of copper in the ground. Goose already has all the tower sections necessary to do the job, and plans to be ready for the 1985/86 season.

N8CXX - Last winter John moved to a different QTH on 1.75 acres and is now starting on the antenna system. He has 90° of Rohn 45G ready to go up, upon which he plans to install a 4L W2PV 20° M yagi at 90° , a 5L NBS 15M yagi at 100° and a sidemounted 6L 10° M yagi, hopefully to be completed by the fall contest season. Inside the shack, John is collecting parts for a $4-1000^\circ$ final to go with his FT102.

MRRC SWEEPSTAKES REPORT

Don't believe everything you read in QST. The May 1984 issue chronicles the results of the 1983 Affilated Club Competition in which MRCC narrowly lost to the North Texas Contest Club. But the published score didn't match a tally of members' scores from the results for either NTCC or MRRC, hence it took three weeks of checking between K8CC, K5ZD and K1WJ at the ARRL to compile an accurate total for each of the two clubs.

Unfortunately, the bottom line is still the same in that Mad River lost. But the margin was incredibly narrow — less than 40,000 points between the two club's 4.5 megapoint scores — that is a difference of less than one percent!!

But there were a few bright spots. WA8YVR blasted K8LX's Michigan CW record into oblivion with a big effort, the second best score ever done from W8. The WB8JBM Contest station swept both modes with the highest scores ever from a W8 multi-op, and two good finishes nationally. We saw best-ever scores from many of the members, and it can only make one optimistic about next year.

TS83Ø CW OFFSET MODIFICATION by Randy Farmer W8FN

As anybody who seriously operates CW will tell you, the offset of a stock TS83Ø is far too high. The only fix that I have seen published involves opening up the VFO unit, which is not really a good idea. I decided to take advantage of the nearly useless XIT function to shift the VFO on CW transmit. Fortunately, the Kenwood people chose to do most of the internal mode switching with 9 VDC signals, which allows use of 12 VDC coil relays to do the offset switching automatically.


This modification simply interrupts the RIT control voltage line running from the VFO to the AF Unit board and switches it to an adjustable DC voltage when the radio is in CW transmit mode. The +9 VDC RIT signal is available in the CW mode at the anode of D10, mounted on the top rear side of the mode switch. This point is (relatively) easy to get to (see inset drawing). The existing wire between the VFO and the AF Unit must be broken. This is a gray wire that emerges from the harness and goes to pin 9 of plug 7 on the AF Unit, which is right next to the control relay. The end of the wire that disappears into the harness is relocated to the moving contact of the new relay. It will probably be necessary to splice a short piece of wire onto the plug end to reach the relay. The new CW offset pot and its associated 6.8K 1/4W resistor can be mounted directly to the pin side of the relay - the leads will hold them in place - see the inset drawing. The relay is mounted in the blank area on the chassis between the VFO unit and the large electrolytic capacitors. A ground lug mounted under the screw holding the AF board mounting plate is bent over and soldered to the low side of the relay coil to hold it in place. A new wire must be run from the anode of D10 on the mode switch to the high side of the relay coil. Dress this wire along the harness that runs from the front panel area around the rear of the VFO unit.

Adjustment of the CW offset pot is straightforward: just adjust the pot for the desired offset on CW. This can be done by monitoring your signal in another receiver or just setting the pot to where the frequency readout goes UP the amount of the desired offset in CW transmit. Be sure your offset is positive, as this simple circuit has the same + or - 2 kHz range as the normal RIT control and you could end up transmitting in the wrong offset direction. Switchover is totally automatic and the only difference from stock operation is that the XIT will not function on CW and you can finally zero beat other stations at a more pleasant beat note.

Special offer for MRRC members: I have a quantity of the 5K pots used for this mod that I can supply at my cost of 25 cents plus an SASE.
