### From the Big Fish Dave Pruett, K8CC k8cc@mediaone.net

Many of us who went to the Dayton Hamvention this year witnessed MRRC have a close brush with fame. Going into the Hamvention, Jeff, KU8E had calculated that based on scores published on the 3830 reflector, MRRC looked to have a very good chance of winning the Medium Category of the ARRL Affiliated Club competition for the 2000 Sweepstakes. Jeff's calculations looked good, and our perception was reinforced when we were asked (along with several other clubs) to be sure to have a representative present at the Hamvention Contest Forum when the awards were handed out.

Severely geeked from the MRRC meeting held shortly before the Contest Forum, MRRC was indeed well represented. However, in one of the more convoluted award speeches I've ever heard, the Medium club gavel was presented to...the Southern California Contest Club. MRRC had lost a very close battle – the margin of victory was only around 60K out of roughly 4.5M points – a little over 1%. Unfortunately, there is no gavel for second place.

Despite our disappointment, there is a lot to be proud of in how we finished. Our score of 4,444,404 points was our fifth best total EVER! It is also 68% better than our score from last year, and 32% better than our average over the past ten years. Our second place finish is better than our ten year average (3.7) and we did a pretty good job of getting people on the air – our 45 entries beat our ten vear average by 10%. While it was announced (with great fanfare) that SCCC had beaten us with only 33 entries, the QST write-up shows

they had 38, which takes away a little of the sting.

June is too early to start talking about SS; we've got a lot of fun stuff to do this summer yet. However, I do want to thank **Mike**, **K9NW** for a fine job tabulating and publishing a running total of our SS results last November. I also want to thank those who got on the air and made points for MRRC – a FB job, y'all!

### MRRC Profiles: K8MM By Goose Steingrass, W8AV w8av@aol.com

Ian Hill, K8MM became interested in Amateur Radio through his grandfather who was a radio operator and gunner on a B-17 in the Pacific Theater during World War II. Ian states, "He (his grandfather) drew up a schematic of a crystal type receiver that they used to build during the war. It consisted of a 'cat whisker' type detector using a razor blade and a very small gauge piece of wire. I never really did get it to work, but I was bitten by the radio bug ever since."

During his years in electronics class in high school, Ian's friend Steve mentioned that he was studying for his no-code ham ticket. Ian thought that this was a pretty good idea, so he bought a book, began studying, and became N8TFR on April 21, 1992. Ian continued to study and earned his extra class ticket approximately nine months later. In addition to N8TFR and his current call K8MM, Ian also sported the call sign of AA8UG for a time. He mentions that Steve, ironically, has to this day never taken the test to earn his ticket!

With the guidance of John Millett, K8JM (a.k.a. K8-Jo-Mama), Ian was introduced into the world of contesting. He credits John with turning him into a CW contest junkie. MM mentions that he spent numerous weekends at John's contesting and hanging on the tower to keep the antennas in shape for the contest weekends. Ian also mentions that he and John have also had some great times operating what Ian calls "the white whale" at K8AQM. He warns that anyone operating at AQM should beware of the contest chili (maybe we should ask the resident expert K8DD about this....W8AV.). They have also participated in several contests at the K8CC "super-multi-contestpalace". Ian would now like to operate a CW contest from a DX location in the near future so that he can be on the other end of the pile-ups.

Ian also credits K8JM with introducing him to MRRC and has been a member of the club for nearly eight years now. His favorite contest is CW Sweepstakes. The 160 meter and CQWW CW contests also place very high on his list of favorites.

When not playing radio, Ian enjoys hunting fishing and playing guitar. When not contesting, K8MM chases DX on CW and on the digital modes. He also enjoys experimenting with antenna and building large towers to support them.

K8MM's station consists of a Kenwood TS-450S, an Icom IC-706MKII, and an Elecraft K2 transceiver. The antenna farm sports a random wire antenna with a SGC-230 antenna coupler for the low bands and a four element 2 m yagi that he uses for aurora and satellite operation. Ian mentions that he really loves the K2 transceiver. "I wanted to build a rig and since I missed out on the Heathkit era, this was a perfect rig to satisfy that need. I can't say enough good things about it."

When asked what he would like to see from MRRC, Ian replies that he likes the fact that the

## MRRC Field Day

The MRRC Field Day operation as K8MAD is happening again in 2001. It will be June 23 & 24 from Case Western Reserve University's Squire Valleyvue farm, located at 37125 Fairmount Boulevard in Hunting Valley, Ohio, on the east side of Cleveland.

We plan to meet at K8MR's QTH Saturday morning, and then convoy to the site (about 10 minutes from Jim's house) around 9:30 am. If you are coming directly to the site, here are the directions:

- I-271 to Cedar Road, east on Cedar to SOM Center Road (Ohio • Rt. 91).
- south on SOM Center Rd. to Fairmount Boulevard (about 3/4 mile), east on Fairmount about 3/4 mile
- to Squire Valleyvue Farm. After entering, take the first road to the left toward the "Manor House", we're at the top of the hill overlooking the valley.

As of this time we're planning a 2A, plus VHF, entry. K8MR is coordinating the effort, please let Jim know if you're coming, what you can bring, etc.

Last year we were second in the country in this very competitive category. We hope to see lots of you there, and to improve on last year's finish!
