5,538,856 points is a new record for MRRC, exceeding the 5,465,897 we scored in 1984 (also an unlimited entry). 63 total entries is the second-best ever for MRRC, exceeded only by the 82 entries from 1984. While the 87,918 average score per entry is an improvement from 2003, it is below the MRRC 28-year average of 97,534

So how did we do? It's hard to tell at this point because we've not heard any claimed totals from MWA. Comparisons on the 3830 reflector would appear to show the two clubs in the same ballpark in terms of big gun scores. However, our claimed total is well below MWA's four year average of right around 6 million, so unless they have a sub-standard year, we may well have fallen short.

Still, there were a number of excellent MRRC scores made this year in SS for which we all should be proud. There were a number of new operators, new stations, and old operators at new stations. Hopefully everyone got their logs in to the ARRL on time, and properly credited to MRRC. If you forgot, even though the deadline is passed get on the computer, send in the log, and pray for mercy:-)
